


Formed in 2012, the Pediatric Dermatology Research Alliance (PeDRA) is a vibrant nonprofit organization driven by the **mission to create, inspire, and sustain research to prevent, treat, and cure childhood skin disease.** 2019 was a great year for PeDRA in many ways, but none greater than the continued progress of its five working groups who continue to advance research through active collaboration.



CROSS-CUTTING RESEARCH

2 studies

PeDRA is demonstrating the strength and diversity of its community, by investing in studies that span each of its working groups to impact families coping with any pediatric skin disease. In 2019, PeDRA aligned 2 industry partners, 7 patient advocacy groups, and 34 sites to study the stigma and psychosocial burden of chronic pediatric skin diseases across 3,500 patient-parent participants. Results from the "Big Study" on the burden of pediatric skin disease are expected by end of 2020.




